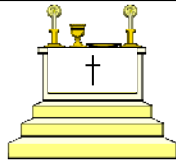

Advantages of a Columbarium at Caroline Episcopal Church

As we discussed at our Town Hall Meeting last week, the vestry has voted to move forward with the implementation of a plan to erect a columbarium in our churchyard. Below is additional information on the benefits of having a columbarium; in the coming weeks, we will offer further details on the columbarium campaign as well.

The columbarium provides a place of remembrance for families wanting to maintain a connection with Caroline Church throughout all of life's great events. The church community is there throughout all of life's stages, from celebrating births, baptisms, communions, and marriages, to commemorating a life once lived, and all of those wonderful and challenging days in between. A columbarium provides the congregation with that close connection to one another within a faith community.

The columbarium will be a monument, located in the center of our cremains area, that honors past members of our congregation who have contributed to our church community. It will act as a meaningful feature to the church landscape and represent the historical contribution and legacy of those who helped build our faith community.

According to the Cremation Association of North America, in 2015, over 48.6% of Americans preferred cremation to in-ground burial. By 2020, that number is projected to be over 60%, and by 2030, over 71%. The trend towards cremation is fast becoming the norm. At present, many cremains remain in the homes of loved ones waiting to find that perfect place for interment. Our columbarium may be that place.

The columbarium adds "value" to the landscape that surround the church. The niches can be sold as a revenue builder to maintain the graveyard or church activities. It is environmentally sound, as well as a cost effective alternative to in-ground burials. Christian faiths across the country are now embracing cremation as an accepted ritual.

Cremation is cheaper than in-ground burial. The average cost of a funeral today is about \$8500, including the typical \$2000 or more cost of a casket. Add in a burial vault, and the average jumps to nearly \$12,700. As of January 2013, a cremation, by contrast, typically costs about one third, or less, of those amounts.
