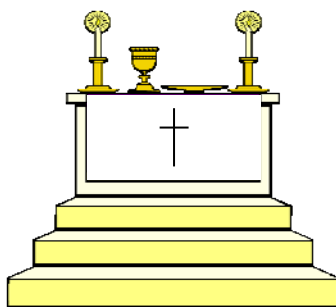

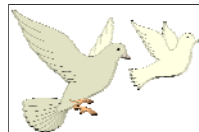

who was a member of the Stony Brook Mission to Puerto Rico

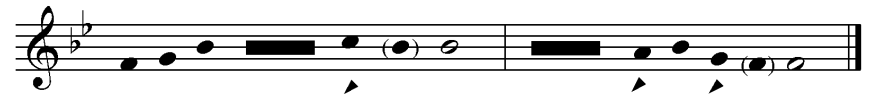

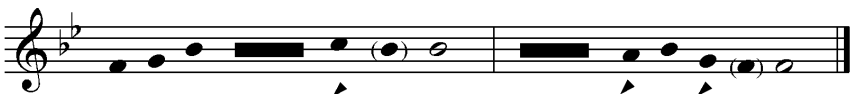
