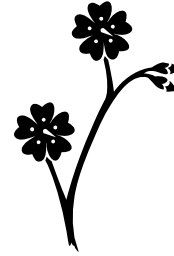

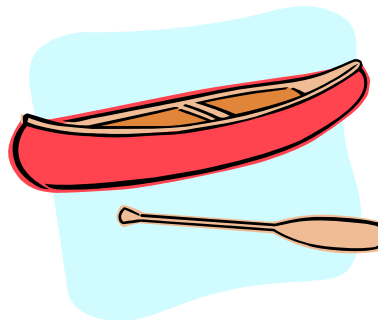

How Inequality is Undermining the American Dream

All people have the right to... productive work, just wages and benefits, to decent working conditions ... to organize and join unions. (US Conference of Catholic Bishops)

America's large middle class symbolizes the American Dream that hard work will lead to economic security and success. However, Robert Reich, former U.S. Secretary of Labor, wrote in the September 4, 2011 New York Times, "Starting in the late 1970s, the middle class began to weaken.

Although productivity began to grow and the economy continued to expand, wages began flattening.... [and] the typical household debt grew by a third" During this time, as middle-class wages and incomes flattened, Reich noted, the wealth of the top 1% "soared," to where they received 23.5% of the national income in 2007, about what they received in 1928, just before the Great Depression.


Here on Long Island, the plight of the middle class is even more dire because of our high cost of living. According to the 2010 study, The Self-Sufficiency Standard for New York State, a family of four needs to earn about \$83,000 to pay the actual Long Island costs for housing, child care, food, transportation, health care and taxes. Since about 45% of Long Island households earn under \$83,000 a year, one does not have to look far to find middle-class Long Island families struggling to make ends meet.

As a September 15, 2011 Newsday editorial titled America's Pain Wide and Deep stated the problem, "For ... blue collar and middle-class Americans...our economy has not been working well for years.... The reasons are complex. The fast-rising cost of health insurance...has been eating up middle-class wage growth. Factory work has been declining for years, in part because of competition from overseas. Technology has changed the mix of skills demanded by employers.... Union membership has declined." Referring to the "deterioration of the middle class," a front-page story in the February 12, 2012 edition of the New York Times reported that "almost half of all Americans [now live] in households that received government benefits in 2010" such as food stamps, the Earned Income Tax Credit and Medicaid or Medicare. As Newsday's editorial on the plight of the middle class concluded, "The resulting picture isn't pretty. Little or no growth, high inequality, sustained joblessness, mounting debts...People's health will suffer. The social fabric will fray." This is the challenge facing our American Dream.

Help in Time of Need

When family situations become strained due to the economy or job issues there are some federal, state and community programs that can offer some assistance. However, even with these resources, some things fall through the cracks. As a member of Caroline Church, you need to know that your parish is here to help as best we can. If you have a need, financial or otherwise, please speak with one of the clergy and let all of us help one another get through those difficult times.
