10 things you can do to pass the **NY DREAM Act**

Over a decade ago, our state was a leader in deciding to extend the right of undocumented youth to pay in-state tuition rates. Today, we join together as the New York DREAM Coalition to call on you to extend the New York State Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) to qualified undocumented students by passing the comprehensive NY DREAM Act that has been introduced to the Legislature (A.2597 / S.2378). With federal comprehensive immigration reform expected in the near future, we feel strongly that New York State has not only a responsibility to act, but also an opportunity to once again lead the nation on progressive issues, such as immigrant rights and education reform.

- 1) **Call or email your New York State Senator:** *"Hi, my name is _____ and I am calling to urge the Senator to co-sponsor and pass the comprehensive NY DREAM Act. The bill introduced by Senator Peralta (S.2378/A.2597) and Assemblyman Moya, which would extend TAP to undocumented youth without delay!"*

- 3) **Share articles and post on Facebook:** "Pass the comprehensive NY DREAM Act extending TAP to New York's undocumented youth. Educational equity for all!"

- 5) **Lobby:** Schedule a meeting with your state representatives or find out a meeting that is already happening by contacting the New York DREAM Coalition.
- 6) **Start a DREAM Team:** Organize your community. Coordinate with the NYS Youth Leadership Council about what it takes to start a campus or community DREAM Team.
- 7) **Have a petition drive:** Help us get thousands of signatures from New Yorkers that will be sent to the Governor and the State Legislature urging them to act!
- 8) **Write a letter:** Send a letter to your state elected official urging them to sponsor A.2597/S.2378 OR to thank them for already doing so!
- 9) **Host an event:** Schedule a NY DREAM Act training in your community and/or campus!

The Long Island Council of Churches calls upon Governor Cuomo and related NYS agencies to impose a moratorium on high-volume hydro-fracking in NYS until a full separate Health Impact Assessment is conducted and subjected to public comment. In particular we are concerned that a full and proper public health assessment be conducted and subject to public comment concerning the impact to public health due to geological factors that are unique and heightened in NYS (which include the presence of radium and other radioactive elements present in NYS shale that may be released into the environment, contaminate waste water or the resulting natural gas, the depth of the shale and the presence of earthquake fault lines)

We, the LICC, call upon Governor Cuomo and related NYS agencies to impose a moratorium on high-volume hydro-fracking in NYS until a full separate Health Impact Assessment is conducted and subjected to public comment. In particular we are concerned that a full and proper public health assessment be conducted and subject to public comment concerning:

LONG ISLAND COUNCIL OF CHURCHES NEEDS A VAN TO FEED THE HUNGRY Why We Need the Van



Our Freeport Emergency Food van is on it's last legs, with over 160,000 miles. To repair it would cost considerably more than the van is worth. We urgently need to replace it with either a new or gently used, well-maintained cargo van.

Food has to be gathered, delivered and distributed if we are to feed our hungry guests. A cargo van is the only way we can pick up food deliveries from Island Harvest, Long Island Cares, local churches and community organizations, etc.

Without a dependable van, we could lose substantial donations from churches and other houses of worship, and from donors who give large amounts of food that they want us to pick up. We estimate that we could lose as much as 20,000 pounds of food a year if we are unable to pick up these food donations. We would also lose donations of clothing, furniture, and many other items our guests urgently need on a daily basis.

A new 2012 Ford Savana Cargo 2500 Extended Wheel-base Work Van is best suited to our needs and the heavy use the van constantly gets. The total cost, including a few basic options such as rear window defogger, air conditioning, and air bags, is \$31,330.

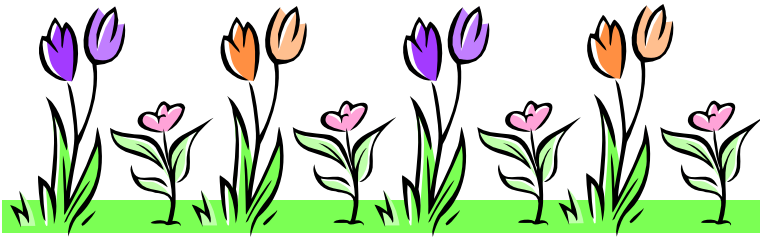
