EXPLORER CAMP (ages 7-11): July 6th – July 11th

\$595 per one-week session

\$1190 per two-week session

ADVENTURE CAMP (ages 12-15): July 27th – August 8th

\$1190 per two-week session

Opportunities to develop skills in activities including sailing, wilderness skills and swimming. June Is Torture Awareness Month

Every June, human rights and faith organizations join together to mark Torture Awareness Month because on June 26, 1987, the nations of the world took a major step against the immoral and abhorrent practice of torture. On that day, the Convention Against Torture and other Cruel, Inhuman and Degrading Treatment or Punishment (CAT for short) entered into force and the United Nations later declared June 26th the “International Day in Support of Victims of Torture.” This June, we will honor survivors of torture, take action to ensure that the truth of the clandestine U.S. torture program after 9/11 is made public, and pray for national repentance and healing toward the restoration of human dignity for all.

“Torture” is a word that evokes horror and a deep sense of spiritual wrongness. It is associated with many of the worst eras of human history and is used today by the world’s worst tyrants. It is cruel, violent, immoral, and illegal. Torture destroys our God given human dignity, and is a sin no one should engage in or be complicit in.

Unfortunately, out of fear, ignorance, anger, and a misguided attempt for safety, U.S. leaders chose to use torture as a means of interrogating suspected terrorists. The use of torture violated our morality and laws, and it ran contrary to the advice of experienced interrogators – who generally agree that using torture is detrimental to obtaining useful intelligence.

Five years ago, our government banned the use of torture as an interrogation method. Since then little information has been made public about the use of torture on 9/11 detainees. However, with an 11-3 bipartisan vote this spring, the Senate Intelligence Committee decided to make public a summary of its report describing the results of its investigation into our government’s use of torture. The report details the horror of a shameful chapter of our history. It is currently being declassified.

The facts in the report will give us critical footing to put in place permanent legal safeguards to prevent the use of torture in the future. By exposing the truth of U.S. torture, the facts are a starting point to support national repentance and healing toward the restoration of human dignity for all.

What You Can Do. Please help ensure that the truth about the torture program is made public and that our leaders use this information to permanently abolish the use of torture. Our leaders need to hear that torture should never again be done in our name. To learn more and join in this important effort, go to: www.nrcat.org/GetInvolved.

A Prayer: May the grace of Christ – who spoke with the Samaritan woman at the well, the stranger – may the grace of Christ strengthen you for acts of mercy and justice. May the love of God – who creates us each in God’s own holy image – may the love of God guide your interactions with fellow humanity and all of creation. And may the comfort of the Holy Spirit – who does not abandon one who is suffering – may the comfort of the Holy Spirit bring you hope in each new day. AMEN.

Low and Moderate Income Energy Program

To the Long Island Community: We are pleased to announce the formation of the Long Island Low-Income Energy Task Force. Through a combination of NY State and Local Community Funding, our coalition of community organizations, energy contractors, fuel providers and government agencies can help Long Islanders receive assistance to dramatically lower their energy bills. Services are available for both renters and homeowners.

Recent reports from the NY Comptroller's Office and other have identified severe housing affordability concerns for residents on Long Island. Nowhere is this more critical than within Long Island's low-income community.

Energy costs represent a major component of the monthly expenses faced by Long Island families, seniors, veterans and disabled. On average, Long Island homes spend in excess of \$4,500.00 annually for heating fuel and electricity. Many times this creates a situation where decisions have to be made whether to heat or eat. Additionally these homeowners and renters, while faced with this severe financial burden, live in homes that are often quite cold and unhealthy.

We are ready to help.

LI Low-Income Energy can help low and moderate income homeowners and renters get grants for improving their home's energy efficiency, lower their monthly expenses and improve comfort. Depending on income and family situation clients can receive either:

Assisted Home Performance (Homeowners only) - \$ 5000.00 grant toward work by a New York State Accredited Energy Efficiency Contractor (requires a 50% cost share by client).

Empower NY (Homeowners and Renters eligible) - Up to \$ 8000.00 grant for energy efficiency measures. Clients receiving # 2 can also take advantage of # 1, as long as they are able to pay for or finance the 50% cost share. Participation in these programs is based upon documentation of income.

Services that can be provided through the LI Low-Income Energy Task Force

Specific measures to be provided are based upon the results of a comprehensive **energy audit** which is provided to the client for **no charge**.

- New Heating Equipment
- Heating Equipment Clean and Tune Service
- Improved Insulation
- Draft Reduction / Air Sealing / Weather Stripping / Caulking
- Programmable Thermostats
- Health and Safety Measures including
- Proper venting of clothes dryer and exhaust fans
- Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Alarms
