

Safe Church Policy

At the last Diocese of Long Island Convention Proposition #4 was unanimously passed by all delegates. It was a change in the Canons of the Diocese to better align our local parishes with the current best practices of the wider church with respect to Safe Church issues.

According to the Safe Church Training Guidelines introduction: *The Diocese of Long Island intends that every parish congregation and every ministry be always places of community, learning, grace, insight, and caring. This begins by assuring that they are safe places. By that we mean, places where the vulnerable are protected from harm, and where all live and work with respect for one another. This beginning point aims toward an end point at which our gathering places for worship, community, and service are experienced as anticipations of the Kingdom of God.*

There are now new policies for Sexual Harassment, Sexual Exploitation, and Protection of Children and Youth in the Diocese of Long Island. Caroline Church also has Policies in effect within those areas.

I am sure we all understand the seriousness of these issues and want our parish to be a welcoming, nurturing and safe environment for all. This being the goal, all parishes within the Diocese, will be requiring that certain individuals within a parish participate in safe church training. Many of our parishioners have already done so with either in-person training or on-line training. However, if you have completed your training over 5 years ago, you must renew.

Diocesan directive for training applies to:


- ♦ Vestry Persons, because of the authority they have to effect parish policy, procedures and program.
- ♦ Leaders of Groups who regularly use our church facilities, because of their wide access to church settings where children, youth and vulnerable populations are present.
- ♦ Key-holders, because of their unencumbered access to church facilities.

This directive then includes all employees of Caroline Church, Clergy and staff, Eucharistic Visitors, church school teachers, Children's Choir Director, Lay youth ministers, volunteer youth directors, nursery workers, Confirmation Mentors, VBS teachers and adult helpers, adults who participate in overnight activities with children or youth more than twice a year, and all those of whatever age possessing a key to the church, parish house or MCS building.

Although you can participate in Safe Church Training by attending a class at Mercer School of Theology in Garden City, almost all of our parishioners would be able to complete an on-line course at any time convenient for them. Safeguarding Online provides training in short, focused courses that can normally be completed in 30 – 40 minutes, and may be taken from any location where a high-speed internet connection is available. A specific password will be given to each individual user.

We have two Caroline Church Safeguarding Online Administrators, Mary Doherty and Chris Haring, who will assist members of our parish in signing in and accessing Safeguarding Online training. If you have any questions about this policy please speak with them or Canon Richard.

It is our goal for everyone to complete their training by Easter. I know this may be a challenge for some of you but we must do everything we can to keep our children and youth safe and respect the dignity of all. *RDV*

Buildings & Grounds

As I write this, there remains at least a foot of snow in the back yard, but it's 45 degrees and at least some should melt over the next few days. The sun is higher in the sky and daylight is approaching twelve hours.

Last month I wrote about the boilers at Caroline going full blast to keep things warm on the inside, and how the programmable thermostats will help hold the bills down. Unfortunately, one of those thermostats was over-ridden and left set in the high seventies for multiple days before the change was discovered. Covers have now been placed on several thermostats to prevent a costly reoccurrence. The thermostats are already set to increase the heat for regularly scheduled meetings, and holes have been drilled in the new covers to allow a temporary change in the temperature for any other meetings or events. But the buttons to change the program or "hold" a new temperature cannot be accessed. If you change the temperature and forget to change it back, the program will reset things after a few hours.

Despite the weather, we are moving forward on interior projects. Several ceilings have been painted. In the MSC Building we're "chasing away the gray" that is on many of the lower walls of the first floor. That charcoal gray is being replaced with a friendlier, but hopefully durable, shade of blue. Barbara Russell is making headway on culling out the library and books are available for the taking. Most are on the piano in the Parish House History Center. No returns please. An additional light has been installed in one of the first floor bathrooms of the MCS Building, and hopefully two stairwells in that building will be repainted shortly.

So while the "to do" list always seems to have an extra two items on it for every one accomplished, we continue to make progress. But certainly everyone is waiting for a chance to accomplish something outside.

Rejoice: spring officially begins in just a few weeks. No April snowstorms please.


Stewards of God's Love

The symbol of our theme is the cross

1. **Down arrow:** Our Relationship with God
2. **In arrow:** What God has entrusted to our care
3. **Out arrow:** Our Relationship with our Neighbor




Vestry Retreat for 2014

On February 8 members of the Vestry participated in their annual retreat at Little Portion Friary. New and returning Vestrypersons filled out the roster. The day began at 9:30 a.m. with Cn. Richard leading the Vestry in Morning Prayer, followed by a reflection. It was a busy morning, as members reviewed the mission of Christ's church, Caroline Church's Vision, Mission, Goal and Objective Statements, examined the vestry's calling to be leaders, and reflected on how we are to relate to each other as understood in our Vestry Covenant.

The Vestry attended a noonday Holy Eucharist with the Brothers, and shared a meal with the community and two other churches on retreat. After lunch, the vestry did a mutual ministry review with Cn. Richard. We reflected on our desire to have more parishioners involved and committed to the ministry and worship of our parish. We discussed ways of strengthening our Christian Formation program. We evaluated last year's goals, and set new ones for 2014. Various Vestry Committee assignments were made and counting teams, bible study sign-ups, and Diocesan expectations were reviewed.

These goals were developed for 2014:

1. In an effort to increase membership, we will promote new parishioner church involvement in the life of the parish and develop and implement an assimilation program for new members. The Welcoming Ministry Team will advance this goal.
2. Study and reorganize our Christian Education and Youth Ministry programs with the goal of maximizing their effectiveness in nurturing our children and young people. The Christian Education Committee will coordinate this effort.
3. Coordinate the calendaring and communication among all our groups and committees. A new Inter-ministry Planning Task Force will spearhead this goal.
4. A new Parish Fellowship Committee will be formed as a social committee promoting community by hosting several family oriented events throughout the year.
5. Encourage greater community use of our facilities. The Community Service Committee will move this forward.
6. Strengthen our partnership with All Souls' Church. The clergy will oversee this process.

The Vestry believes, with God's blessing and the commitment of all parishioners, that we will move forward on the goals established for 2014.

The Vestry Covenant

Recognizing that Holy Scripture will be our authority governing our behavior and relationships with one another and with the larger congregation, and acknowledging St. Paul's directive to Timothy (1 Tim 4:12) concerning his role as church leader to be "an example to the believers in speech, life, love, faith and purity," we therefore agree to the following:

To love one another

1. Creating and nurturing within the Vestry a safe and trusting atmosphere in which all members can feel comfortable and confident in expressing their thoughts and opinions,
2. Being sensitive to the different styles and personalities of individual Vestry members,
3. Seeking to validate, appreciate, acknowledge, and understand the unique and special gifts of each Vestry member,
4. Treating each Vestry member with respect by speaking and acting in such a way as to build up and support one another and confronting issues without demeaning anyone,
5. Refusing to listen to backbiting or gossip about any other Christian, especially other church leaders,
6. Insisting that people who have accusations to be made against another church leader do so in the presence of that individual,
7. Recognizing that certain discussions are of a confidential nature, thus maintain good, wise judgment in respecting that confidentiality,
8. Confronting with love those individuals who have hurt me in any way,
9. Following St. Matthew's principle (Mt. 18:15-17) for conflict resolution between individuals: speaking first to the individual alone; if to no avail, bringing another (Vestry member) and then, if necessary, finally referring the matter to the larger church (entire Vestry),
10. Practicing forgiveness for those I feel have wronged me,
11. Seeking to encourage those Vestry members, who may be suffering through trials of one kind or another,
12. Nurturing a servant attitude in that the Vestry's role is that of serving both God and His church;

To seek God's will by striving for unity in all matters through

1. Joining with the entire Vestry in submitting significant matters to prayer, especially prior to voting or decision-making,
2. Upholding the final decision of the Vestry even when I may disagree,
3. Always seeking to better understand others,
4. Submitting to one another in love,
5. Refraining from all discussions and conversations that are unwholesome and from following a divisive course,
6. Consciously seeking to abandon personal agendas and self-serving attitudes;

To be an example to the congregation by striving to

1. Faithfully attend Sabbath worship,
2. Consistently engage in study of the scriptures,
3. Live out the Christian life through regular, sacrificial giving,
4. Support the church through active attendance and participation,
5. Be faithful to Caroline Church's Vision, Mission, Goals & Objective Statements.

In summary, we will, in the words of St. Paul to the Colossians (Col.3:12-14), "as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, seek to clothe ourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, and patience. We will bear with one another and forgive whatever grievances we may have against one another. We will seek to forgive as the Lord forgave us. And over these virtues we will put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity."
