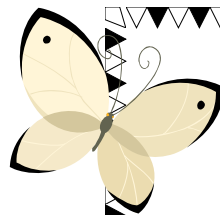

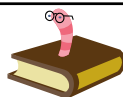

Several of us attended the "Giftings 2013" at Church of the Advent in Westbury for a time of ministry and teaching sponsored by students from the 'Global School of Supernatural Ministry' in Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania.

Friday night included a time of singing and worship with a personal witness shared by one of the students from the school who's life was changed when she gave her life to Jesus 20 years ago. She had been an active member of the Methodist Church but found that as the Lord began to heal and work in her life, and as she began to give herself over to Christ to allow Him to work in hers, she had to leave her church and find a place to worship that fed her soul and encouraged her in her walk with the Lord. She joined an evangelical, non-denominational church and has spent the last 3 years (she is now 66) as a student in the Global School for Supernatural Ministry.

Saturday found us back to hear teachings on:

1. How to hear God's voice
2. Prophetic protocol
3. Receiving and operating in Words of Knowledge.
4. Five step prayer model for Healing
5. Deliverance training

The program places an emphasis on impartation and equipping people (students) for a life spent walking in the supernatural.

Our group was blessed by the teachings. Many of us have heard much of the teaching imparted over the years as part of our involvement in Healing Ministry. We were encouraged to step out in faith to be encouragers to use the gifts given by the Holy Spirit, and to ask for more gifts so that we might strengthen His Kingdom. We were encouraged by the passions that these witnesses had for Christ and their desire to share Him with others and make a difference in lives today.
