My Dear Friends in Christ,

I would guess that many of you may not have been aware that the first Monday in October is Child Health Day. Although originally observed on May 1 under a joint resolution of Congress in 1928, every United State president has proclaimed Child Health Day, the first Monday in October. Our government realized that we need to be reminded of all the ways children grow healthy and strong. This may involve best diets to follow or heightened intellectual opportunities. Our children certainly need all the support and opportunities we can give them to grow. Certainly, there are many ways to observe this day: From hiking, to community playgrounds, to household chores, and other activities that promote child health.

An important way to honor Child Health Day is to focus more on our children's spiritual life. As a concerned parent of a Caroline Church young person, I know that you want the very best for your son or daughter. That desire also flows through to their spiritual development. That is why we have a fantastic church school program for them every Sunday morning here at Caroline. Worship and learning at church should be a priority and a consistent part of a child's life.

I want to share you some thoughts from a concerned parent, Jenny Funderburke, who gives 5 reasons for bringing your child to church. See if they resonate with you.

1. **Spiritual development matters just as much as any other area.** We tend to focus on the development we can see. Are our kids learning to walk on time or learning to read at the same rate as their peers? We care so much (too much?) about their development and success in sports or other interests. We hire tutors and worry about their future grades when they are still in preschool. We are the generation that flooded our littles with Baby Einstein because we really thought it might make them smarter. I could quote you dozens of statistics of why childhood is an essential time frame for spiritual development. This is a huge developmental window in kids' lives, and as parents we owe it to them to focus on spiritual development just like we focus on academic, athletic, etc....

2. **Our kids need voices we can trust that aren't ours.** Maybe your kids are different than mine. But often my words or advice or great wisdom go in one ear and out the other. BUT, if another significant adult in their lives says the EXACT SAME WORDS, they totally hear it. Our kids need significant relationships with adults and other kids who are pointing them toward the things we are. No

one is structured better to do this in a consistent and healthy way than the church. Good children's ministries and youth ministries work hard to have safe, quality, incredible people who can be role models and additional voices in your kids' lives.

3. **Life is hard, and no one needs to do life alone.** Everyone needs community. Everyone needs people. Everyone needs a place where they belong and they fit. When life falls apart, and it will in some form or another, your kid...your family...needs people. I cannot imagine my kids going through the things they have over the past couple of years without a faith family to love them and support them. Just the consistency of going to church each week with people they know and love provided so much stability when everything around them felt shaky.

4. **Kids need to be a part of something bigger than themselves.** If we are honest, this generation of kids (and probably a couple of previous generations as well) has a lot of entitlement issues. Our kids need to know that there is a world that is bigger than their own. The church allows kids to be a part of a body of believers who serve a God bigger than them and work together to accomplish things bigger than them. A healthy church helps kids participate in projects and activities that help others in their community and in the world. Being a part of the church helps kids learn that life is not all about them.

5. **There is a God who loves them so very much.** This is bottom line truth. Your kids need to be in church because there is a God who so very much wants to be in relationship with them. There is a God who is faithful and good and has an amazing plan for their lives. He is there even when you can't be. He loves them even more than you can, as hard as that is to fathom. He wants the very best for them, even more than you do. Your home is the very best

place for them to learn about Him, but the church is a very close second and should be your partner in pointing kids to Him.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, when you think about these reasons for our children to be in regular attendance at church, it is pretty clear that they really are the same reasons we adults need to be worshipping and learning about God together at Caroline Church. I hope you realize that the spiritual investment you make in their and your lives, matters tremendously and is worth so much more than any other fleeting physical, intellectual or social skill. Our Anglican Heritage

Henry Martyn

Translator of the Scriptures and Prayer Book into Hindi and Persian, Henry Martyn, an English missionary in India, died in Armenia when he was thirty-one years old. Though his life was brief, it was a remarkable one.

Like most English clergymen of the time, he was educated at one of the two ancient universities, Cambridge in his case. He had intended to become a lawyer, but Charles Simeon (November 12), the notable Evangelical rector of Holy Trinity, Cambridge, inspired him to go to India as a missionary. After serving as Simeon's curate for a short time, Martyn traveled to Calcutta in 1806 as chaplain of the East India Company.

During his five years in India, Martyn preached the Gospel, organized private schools, and founded churches. In addition to his work as a missionary, Martyn translated the New Testament and the Book of Common Prayer into Hindi, a valuable missionary aid to the young Anglican Church in India. He also began the study of Persian, and translated the New Testament into Persian.

Martyn longed to go to Persia; in 1811, his persistence brought him to Shiraz, to become the first English clergyman in that city. He engaged in theological discussions with learned Muslims and had time to correct his Persian translations. Obviously gifted with a remarkable facility for languages, Martyn hoped eventually to visit Arabia, and to translate the New Testament into Arabic.

While on his way to Constantinople in 1812, however, he died in the city of Tokat. The Armenians of the city recognized his greatness and buried him with the honors usually accorded to one of their own bishops. Very soon afterwards, his life of energetic devotion and remarkable accomplishment became widely known. He is remembered as one of the founders of the modern Christian Church in India and Iran. In the Episcopal Church, we celebrate his life and ministry every October 19.

President Donald Trump and Members of Congress,

As bishops of the Episcopal Church we implore you not to end the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals, known as DACA. To do so would endanger the lives of thousands of young people and their families and run contrary to the faith and moral traditions of our country.

Any of these scenarios, we believe, is cruel.

The alternative for us as a country is to move forward, to celebrate and benefit from the presence of these 'Dreamers' and to provide a pathway to citizenship that enables them to remain and strengthen our country.

The Episcopal Church has long advocated for bipartisan comprehensive immigration reforms that prioritize family unity and humanitarian concerns. It is time for Congress to act to develop long-term solutions for immigrant families.

In front of most of the Episcopal Churches across the country is a sign that says, 'The Episcopal Church Welcomes You.' We have this sign because we are followers of the way of Jesus of Nazareth, and our Christian tradition shares with many other faith bodies the absolute importance of welcoming the foreigner in our midst.

Throughout the centuries this tradition has brought us great wisdom and strength as the foreigner among us has become a part of the fabric of our country's life. In recent years, our congregations throughout the United States have witnessed firsthand the benefits that the young 'Dreamers' have brought to our community programs and life. We have been inspired by, and gained much from, their American spirit.

We urge you to enact permanent, meaningful legislation that will protect 'Dreamers' and enable these young people to remain a part of our country-which is also theirs.

At Caroline Church our Ushers help distribute the Sunday bulletin, seat people as needed, facilitate the collection of the daily offering, assist the congregation in receiving Holy Communion and may read the first lesson from the Lectionary. Difficult? No.! Needed? Yes! A few more volunteers would mean fewer times to serve each month. Although all three Sunday services could use help, we particularly need Ushers for the 11:15 a.m. service. You will receive the necessary training from an experienced Usher. We hope this fast, convenient and consistent way of giving to the ministry at Caroline Church is something that you will embrace and support.

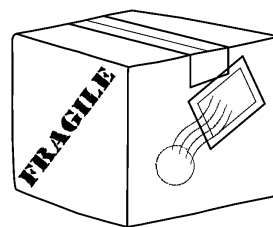
Prayer Shawl Ministry

Infants through age three years are cared for by an adult in a clean and well-equipped nursery off the main room in the MCS building during the 9:30 a.m. Sunday morning worship service.

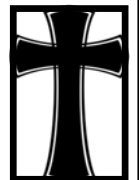

Empty boxes are available for you to pick up and fill in the MCS building or at the back of the church. If you have any questions please contact the parish office. Thank you.

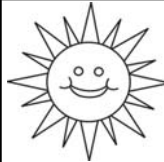

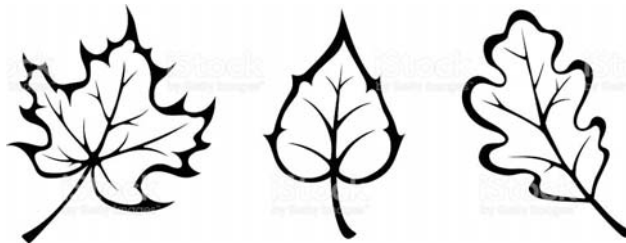
