**Regular meetings:** Wednesday evenings downstairs in the Parish House at All Soul's Church, 10 Mill Pond Rd., Stony Brook. Wine & cheese social hour at 6:45pm, videos and discussion beginning at 7:15, Compline about 8:45pm.

**Program:** Genesis

**Videos:** Gary A Rendsburg, "The Book of Genesis," 24 half hour lectures, normally viewed two per evening.

**Schedule:** The whole series is to be viewed on Wednesdays beginning September 11th and not including the day before Thanksgiving (November 27th). The last meeting is expected to be no later than December 18th.

**Continuity:** Participants are invited to come whenever they want. Each lecture is largely independent on the previous lectures.



**Lecturer:** Gary Rendsburg is the Blanche and Irving Laurie Professor of Jewish History at Rutgers University, New Brunswick. Previously he was a professor at Cornell University for almost 20 years.

**Approach:** The lecturer approaches Genesis from four perspectives - literary, historical, theological, and archaeological. He shows that the apparently simple tales in Genesis are the product of great literary sophistication.

He compares the text of Genesis with sources from other cultures, he gives insights into the religion of the time, and he takes advantage of a vast array of archaeological evidence. His lectures present various theories about the question of authorship. He also addresses certain social issues-the role of women in the Bible, the great variation among translations of the Bible, and the ways in which different generations of Jews and Christians have understood the text differently.

**Handouts:** A number of handouts will be distributed at the first meeting, including a list of lecture titles, a glossary, and a bibliography. For each lecture, a lecture outline of perhaps four or five pages will be distributed.

In order for us to have a better sense of what is going on in that Diocese with the people and mission, parishioner Sue Studier would like to share with you this powerful video that really gives us an appreciation for their need for God's grace.

Here is the link: <http://youtu.be/8sxOB7gTHqQ> It will take you to a documentary video about a few doctors from Omaha, Nebraska who took a group of doctors and nurses and church volunteers to the native village of one of these doctors in South Sudan. He had come to the USA as a refugee, worked his way through college and medical school, and then wanted to give back to his community. It's a good picture of the native community in general, as well as a frightening look at the medical problems they face because of malnutrition and shortage of water and lack of medical care, but beyond the unpleasant realities, these are a lovely, grateful group of people. It's even touching to see that they wore their best clothes to come for this medical service, standing in long lines. The program was prepared by ABC-TV for audiences in Nebraska, but I think it's worthy of nationwide attention, either via ABC or maybe PBS, but meanwhile it's possible to see it on our own computers. It's 48 minutes long, which is kind of long to sit glued to the computer screen, but I found it so interesting that I wasn't aware of the passing of time.

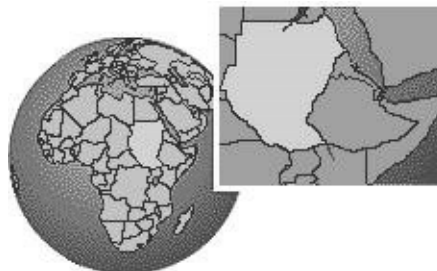

### A Message from The Diocese of Long Island The Violent Situation in Egypt and Christian Suffering

August 18, 2013

The Rt. Rev. Lawrence C. Provenzano and members of his staff

These past several weeks in the nation of Egypt have revealed the fundamental uncertainties with which we all live in the present-day world. What is democracy? What is a coup? What is the shape of religious freedom? What is the shape of freedom in any event? And most deeply of all, we ask the question of 'what next'?

During recent days and nights the level of violence in Egypt has increased exponentially: violence by the present military government against the Muslim Brotherhood and their supporters; and, of concern to us in the household of faith, violence against Christians, particularly the Copts. Ancient tradition witnesses Christianity in Egypt from the time of Saint Mark in the first century AD. From the third century AD, Christians were the majority religious group in Egypt and contributed enormously to the faith and the intellectual life of the whole Church. They are, truly, our sisters and brothers.

In the chaos of Egypt in the present moment, made emblematic by television and internet transmissions from Tahrir Square in Cairo-but stretching far beyond that location-it is difficult for anyone to know either the full extent or the direction of violence. We deplore all of it. In the name of the one God worshipped by the monotheistic faiths, we call for a cessation of violence. More than that, we call for peace. We call for the beginning of talks among all parties in that nation. Only by hearing one another is there any hope of mutual understanding to grow.


A few days ago, on August 14th, one photo came out of the maelstrom that is said to show a ring of white-robed Egyptian Muslims standing hand-in-hand to protect a Christian church while the Eucharist is celebrated. While we cannot be absolutely assured of its veracity, this image is a powerful reminder of our common humanity, that all of us belong to one another, and that our first call is to stand with one another as brothers and sisters, not against each other as mute adversaries. This is saving truth.

Right now, and in ongoing fashion, our thoughts and prayers are with our brothers and sisters in Egypt. Their Jesus and ours knew innocent suffering. He experienced as well the faithfulness of God the Father that stretches beyond death and brings new life. May the God of us all move powerfully among the Egyptian people to bring the gift of calm, of peace, of possibility. And may they-and indeed all of us-be ready and willing to accept that gift.

I ask the clergy and people of the Diocese of Long Island to join together in prayer and in efforts to promote peace. I ask that this statement be shared with the people of the diocese.

Let our prayers and our voices be heard in seeking peace.
