Hello Fellow Parishioners, I am writing to inform you of an endeavor I have taken on which is an item on my "bucket list". I am running the NYC marathon this November 2. I have done numerous half marathons but this is my first full one.

In taking on this challenge I have decided to dedicate my efforts to something bigger than myself. I have joined Fred's Team and will be running the marathon as part of their charity which raises funds for cancer research for Sloan Kettering Memorial hospital. As many of you probably know, Sloan Kettering is at the forefront of cancer treatment and research. Many of the breakthroughs that occur in cancer treatment come as a result of the research and clinical trials taking place at this facility. In fact, Sloan Kettering was just ranked the #1 hospital for cancer care in the nation by US News and World Report in their 2014-2015 listing of best hospitals.

There are 3 reasons that I run. I run in MEMORY of my two Grandmothers who lost their lives to cancer. They were both living with my family as they fought this disease. Watching them both fight and then succumb to this disease has left an indelible memory with me. I also run in SUPPORT of those fighting cancer. My father-in-law is currently in remission from pancreatic cancer thanks to the amazing treatment and care he received as a patient at Sloan Kettering. I run for him. I run for a friend fighting breast cancer and a close childhood friend's mother who is battling brain cancer. I run for them and the countless others who are fighting the battle of their lives against this awful disease. And finally, I run for HOPE. Hope that one day, I pray in my lifetime, that we may see an end to cancer. As the Fred's team slogan says...I can imagine a world without cancer. What a wonderful world that would be!

Welcome INN

The Welcome INN was started in the Port Jefferson area in 1989 and serves 5 days a week at 4 local churches. We are one of the 14 soup kitchens mentioned in the history document. Our original funding was from an anonymous bequest- lasting us several years without the need to fund raise. We now have over 130 volunteers from numerous faith organizations who volunteer their time to pick up food, prep the day's dinner, cook, serve and clean-up.

Several of our Caroline parishioners are regularly involved in two of the local church soup kitchens: Christ Church United Methodist in Port Jefferson Station (1st, 2nd and alternating 5th Tuesdays) and Christ Episcopal Church in Port Jefferson Village (every Monday).

In addition to feeding our homeless citizens, the INN also operates three emergency shelters on Long Island and 12 long term homes for 20 families and 7 veterans.

The INN addresses the issues of hunger and homelessness on Long Island by providing food, shelter, long term housing and supportive services in a dignified and respectful manner for those who seek our help.

This is a not-for-profit, volunteer-based organization with a dedicated staff, a broad base of community support and a commitment to educate the public about these issues.

Child Welfare Legislation

The **Child Welfare Provider Inclusion Act [S. 2706, H.R. 5285]** has been introduced by Senator Mike Enzi (R-WY) and Representative Mike Kelly (R-PA) to protect the right of child welfare providers to continue providing their valuable services but decline, when conscience demands, to provide any service that conflicts with their religious or moral convictions.

An agency should not be forced to shut down simply for holding to the common sense idea that children do best with a married mom and a dad! These agencies should be allowed to continue their good work without being threatened with discrimination or denied merited funding for their contributions to society simply because they will not compromise on their deeply held religious convictions.

Faith-based child welfare providers have done invaluable service to America, and especially America's orphans and children in need, since the founding of this great nation. This important legislation will protect not only the rights of these crucial service providers, but even more importantly the rights of the children whom they have served so well for so long.

If you agree, that this Child Welfare Provider Inclusion Act should be passed by congress, send a message to Congress today and encourage support for this critical legislation. You are encouraged to contact our representatives: Senator Kirsten Gillibrand (D-NY) and Senator Charles E. Schumer (D-NY).
